## Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES) Act of 2020

• Provides a number of different programs to address the COVID-19 pandemic

- One program is the CARES Coronavirus Relief Fund (CRF) which provides direct assistance to state, local, territorial, and tribal governments for impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.
  - Virginia received \$3.1 billion in CARES CRF funding and has shared 50% of their allotment with local jurisdictions based on population.

## County's Allocation: \$9,538,621

# Must Expend by December 30, 2020\*

\* New Guidance from U.S. Treasury on 6-30-20

### CARES CRF Funds are to be:

- Shared with the Town of Scottsville (based on population)
- Used for qualifying expenses that:
  - Are incurred during the period of March 1, 2020 to December 30, 2020
  - Are expenditures incurred due to COVID-19
  - Were not accounted for in a budget most recently approved as of March 27, 2020
  - Are not to be used for ongoing services and/or base operations

### Response Goals:

- Reduce transmission to staff and public
   Protect people who are at higher risk
- 3) Maintain essential services

#### Reconstitution Goals:

- 1) Protect the health and safety of staff and residents
- 2) Support all people and communities
- 3) Facilitate a safe transition to "normal" county operations and community economic recovery
